Tips on Touring the Festival

WHEN to COME? In April! – Least crowded times: Weekdays! Weekends are very busy; arrive before 10 am to beat the crowds. ° e festival is a driving tour, with events MILES apart. Our brochure map is not to scale.

TULIPS - There will be tulips for you to see ALL of April.

PLEASE NOTE – Drones are <u>not</u> allowed in the gardens or the fields.

SHOW GARDENS – Visiting both RoozenGaarde and Tulip Town is a must! Over one million spring bulbs are planted in the gardens. Both charge admission; RoozenGaarde tickets cannot be used at Tulip Town and vice versa. Pets are not allowed in the gardens.

WHEN do TULIPS BLOOM? – Skagit Valley tulips have been farmed here since the early 1900s. Today the "field tulips" are the crops of the Washington Bulb Co., Inc. /RoozenGaarde. ° e field tulips bloom in April, but weather determines exactly when. Check bloom status at www.tulips.com/bloommap, call us at (360) 428-5959, go to www.tulipses-

<u>tival.org</u>, visit <u>www.Facebook.com/SkagitValleyTulipFestival</u>. Tulip crops rotate, so you WILL need a new map each year.

PARKING – Park FREE at the two gardens, RoozenGaarde and Tulip Town. Tulip Town parking is on Bradshaw Road. RoozenGaarde on Beaver Marsh Rd. Both have OVERFLOW lots on busy days; flaggers will direct you. RoozenGaarde also operates Oÿ cial PAY parking by some of the tulip fields. Parking in designated lots is included with paid RoozenGaarde admission (show your ticket stub) OR your Oÿ cial PAY lot ticket stub is good for ONE admission to RoozenGaarde. Admission/parking must all occur on the same day. **NOTE: too much rain may close lots by the fields.**

Private Parking – Landowners sometimes charge for parking. ° e money you pay cannot be used for admission or other parking.

Shoulder Parking – Very limited! Sheri 's Oÿ cers will issue tickets!

DETAILED trave **DIRECTIONS**

ese detailed instructions should help you get from I-5 Exits to the tulip growing area. Exits 230 and 221 are recommended during peak travel times.



Burlington Exit Exit I-5 and head west on SR 20 toward Anacortes

Proceed west on SR 20 for 3 miles until you reach Best Rd/Farm To Market Rd; Turn Left on Best Rd and proceed 1.7 miles until you reach McLean Rd.

This will put you at the McLean Rd roundabout, in the center of the tulip growing area.

There are numerous routes you can follow — consult the Festival map to decide.



Conway Exit Exit off Interstate 5 and head west toward LaConner

Proceed approximately 0.1 mile. Enter the roundabout and turn onto Fir Island Rd and proceed west 5.1 miles where the road curves to the left and up an incline to a bridge over the Skagit River. Cross the bridge and continue for 3.1 miles when you will arrive at the intersection of Best and Calhoun roads. You are now at the southern edge of the tulip growing area. From here, use the Festival map to visit events and activities, find your favorite field or visit the gardens, RoozenGaarde and Tulip Town.



Mount Vernon Exit Exit off I-5 and head west for 0.1 mile

Turn right onto S Third St for 0.3 miles, then EITHER continue onto W. Division St for 0.5 miles (you will cross the Skagit River)
Turn Left onto S Wall St; Wall St turns into McLean Rd in 249 feet; Continue on McLean Rd for 2.5 miles.

OR continue onto W Division St for 2.3 miles (you will cross the Skagit River)
Turn Left onto Avon Allen Rd for 1.1 miles; Turn Right onto McLean Rd and proceed 1 mile
to Beaver Marsh Rd.

At this point you can turn Left onto Beaver Marsh Rd and proceed 0.4 miles to Roozen-Gaarde. Or, you can proceed on for 1 mile and turn Right onto Bradshaw Rd and proceed 0.5 miles to Tulip Town.



The quickest route out of the tulip field area is SR 20 Use the Festival map to locate where you are and proceed to SR 20 and

east to I-5. If you decide to leave via Fir Island Rd to the south, we suggest you consider using the following route from the intersection of Fir Island Rd and Pioneer Highway: Enter the roundabout and turn onto Pioneer Highway and proceed south 2.3 miles; Turn left onto Milltown Rd and proceed east 0.9 miles. This is the intersection of I-5 and Exit 218. From here you can proceed north or south on I-5 to your end destination.






